

The procedure below should never be needed since the installer manages the data upgrade.

In case anything fails with the automatic upgrade through **tiki-install.php**, you can manually upgrade the database.

If you prefer to do on the command line, you can also use:

<b>upgrade a Tiki database</b>
--------------------------------

```
php installer/shell.php
```

At the end, you should manually create a file called "lock" inside the **db/** folder where your local.php file is stored, in order to secure your installation.
